It is almost 2 years now since Covid came into our lives and changed our behavior in so many ways. Our hope for the future is that Covid will be something we will learn to live with in much the same way as we do with the common cold and flu.

Throughout the pandemic the council continued to have the usual meetings albeit using Zoom whilst legally permitted. We are now back to meeting together in the community centre but have tried to make things easier for residents who prefer not to mix with others indoors by taking questions and comments sent to us by various means for our consideration. The minutes of meetings are available as always on our website www.greatnotley.org.uk and the Parish clerk Suzanne Walker also uses our Facebook group to notify residents of important matters and items of interest. We are also pleased to have been able to hold our part of the council tax this year to the same level as last.

Last year we changed the format of both the Remembrance service and the Christmas event. The first was prompted by worries about keeping people apart as the Covid situation became worse again. We felt it was time for a change at Christmas and how pleased we were to find so many people prepared to come along and join us on the green around the Christmas tree. We have many people to thank for the success of the evening but particularly Suzanne Walker, the staff at the Community Centre, the members of Great Notley WI, Tesco for the food, the Scouts for the gazebos and, of course, the Strayhorn Brass Quintet. We must not forget Father Christmas too who made the long journey to visit the children.

The free pantomime organized by the NGCA and sponsored by Gridserve before the carols proved to be a great success too and it was a pity there were no more space as the tickets went very quickly and, sadly, many were disappointed.

There were some concerns about the fate of the Christmas tree after the event. We had made arrangements for someone to have it but this fell through and so we are already looking into the possibility of planting a tree to be used each year. This seems the best way forward as we are all being encouraged to plant more trees for environmental reasons.

The council has hopes that a suggested community orchard could also be a possibility if a suitable plot could be found somewhere in the village.

The allotment provision has moved on to our looking into costs for amenities such as the water supply, though the actual plot of land is still not well defined. Other concerns are being addressed and we are writing to the Police Fire and Crime Commissioner about the ongoing racing cars problem. Residents often have concerns about planning too and especially large developments but we have to follow strict procedures when dealing with these. We must make our comments to the appropriate authorities, on behalf of the community, at the correct time lest our opinions are forfeited.


The village is coming awake as we move into spring and plants and trees are once more in bud. We continue to maintain high standards in vegetation management and cleanliness and in December and January we engaged a specialist team to deep clean the areas our litter pickers are unable to reach (for safety reasons) and are looking into making this an ongoing occurrence. We have had the dust cart visit on 29th January and a couple of occasions when small electrical appliances could be disposed of. This all goes towards making our Parish a lovely one for us all.

Crime Prevention

Over Christmas you may have been lucky enough to have received some new IT and other gifts, but have you helped protect them yet?

Where applicable have you registered your purchase with the relevant company it may help

with future possible updates and the serial number will be assigned to you with the company. Depending on the item and value have you considered adding it to your home or other insurance?



Have you thought about **recording the serial numbers or property marking** it? Be it a cycle, electrical goods, tools, garden equipment or mobile phone it may have a serial number. There are a number of secure asset recording companies such as www.immobilise.com , www.bikeregister.com. Property can also be marked in a number of different ways depending on the item of property such as engraving, marking with indelible or UV pens, and there are marking products such as: SelectaDNA, SmartWater, CRE mark by CRE products to name but a few (always check the suitability of the method of marking for the property item).

With jewellery and antiques don't forget to **take photographs** of it, include an "Object ID card" or ruler in a photograph to give it a scale. Some of these property marking products may also be suitable for these and you can now upload photographs of your property to Immobilise too.

Many TV's, personal music devices, computers and other electronics come pre-loaded with security and/or tracking software, make sure that it is activated. **If you are storing valuable college work or other on a laptop or mobile device don't forget to back up your work elsewhere just in case you lose it or it is stolen.**

Smart phones/mobile devices: Don't forget to make a note of the **IMEI number** of a mobile phone, to find it key in *#06#, with this if

it's stolen you can block it. You can **download an "App" on mobile phones** to find your phone and more importantly wipe that data stored on it, check your "App store" or mobile phone provider. A little reminder -When texting or talking on phones or listening to music **remain "in touch" with your surroundings**, a number of road accidents, thefts and assaults occur when we fail to note what's going on around us, don't forget to pass this advice on to children.





How to help hedgehogs

**HEDGEHOG
STREET**

CITY OF WILDLIFE



GARDEN FOR HEDGEHOGS

Wildlife features like log piles, leaf piles, compost heaps and an undisturbed 'wild patch' will provide shelter and insect food for hedgehogs.

MAKE YOUR GARDEN SAFE

Remove hazards like litter, netting and chemicals, and check thoroughly before strimming and mowing. Ensure ponds have a sloped side or escape ramp for any hedgehogs that fall in.

BED AND BREAKFAST

Hedgehog houses can be bought online or built with our instructions. Supplementary food is also a great way to help – meaty cat or dog food and a shallow dish of water!

LET THEM IN!

Give hedgehogs access to your garden with 13cm x 13cm square Hedgehog Highways in or under your fence, and encourage neighbours to do the same.

The Parish Council hosted the service of Remembrance on Sunday 14th November 2021. To provide people with plenty of room to spread out in view of the ongoing Covid situation a decision was made to host the event on the green. Thanks to the WINGS Women's Institute for not just decorating the village sign but also the jubilee oak which provides a focal point for the service which was hosted by the Revd. Rachel Prior and the Revd. David Sebley. As well as local beavers, cubs, Scouts, Rainbows and Brownies, the event was attended by a number of residents. The last post was played by Rachel Hockley Warner. It is hoped that residents found this solemn event a suitable tribute to the fallen.



Afterwards there was an opportunity to attend the Community Centre for refreshments and thanks to the Notley Green Community Association for hosting the event and to the Tesco store for providing the refreshments free of charge.

A special mention must be made to a local resident who was collecting for the Royal British Legion. Fred Illman was standing in the foyer at the Tesco store and managed to collect a total of £7,886.17 by selling poppies which was a wonderful achievement.



Spring Skies

Find the Big Dipper. In northern latitudes it will be high in the sky, almost directly overhead, but even as far south as Rio de Janeiro it will still be visible to the north. The two stars at the end of the bowl are called the Pointer Stars. Follow the line they make towards the northern horizon, and you'll run into Polaris, the pole star. Face this star, and you face due north.

Turn yourself around so that you're facing south, so that you have to bend over backwards to see the Dipper; then straighten up, looking south, about one dipper's length below North the dipper, and you'll see a collection of stars that looks like a backwards question mark. Some people call this the Sickle. Since this collection of stars is part of the constellation of Leo, the Lion, a more imaginative way is to say these stars represent the lion's mane.

The bright star at the foot of this mirrored question mark, or mane, is called Regulus. It is a bright, first-magnitude star.

From the Lion, turn and face the west. Standing up on the western horizon will be the two stick men who make up Gemini, the twins. The bright stars that make up their heads are Castor (the twin on the right, to the north) and Pollux (on the left, to the south). South of them is an even brighter star, Procyon. In April, the bright stars of Orion and Canis Major, including Sirius, the brightest star of them all, are low in the west at sunset. As the season proceeds, these stars are lost to the twilight, one by one. Return to the Big Dipper, and now "arc to Arcturus and spike to Spica." In other words, follow the arc of the Big Dipper's handle as it curves to the south and east. The first brilliant star you'll find along this arc is Arcturus. A magnitude zero star, it is one of the brightest stars in the sky, and it has a distinct orange color. Continuing on this arc farther south, you'll come across a very bright blue star, called Spica. It's in the constellation Virgo. These two stars are our main guideposts to the east.

The Twins, Leo (with Regulus), and Virgo (with Spica) are all zodiac constellations. That means that planets will often be visible among these stars. Any bright "star" among these constellations that doesn't 'twinkle' is probably a planet, and well worth looking at.

Finally, rising on the eastern horizon will be the Summer Triangle of Deneb, Vega, and Altair. And just peeping over the horizon, in the zodiac constellation of Scorpius, is the reddish rival of Mars, Antares. These will be our guideposts for later in the year- or later in the night.



Update

The Parish Council hopes that residents enjoyed the Christmas events this year! On Saturday 18th December the Notley Green Community Association hosted a Pantomime Jack and the Beanstalk. The event was free to attend thanks to a generous donation from Gridserve and many local families enjoyed the event!

After the Pantomime the Parish Council hosted a Carols Around the Christmas tree event which was attended by almost 300 people! Everyone gathered around a decorated and lit



and lit Christmas tree.



The music was provided by the Strayhorne brass quintet and the singing was led by children from Notley Green school. Free glowsticks were provided to the children and everyone seemed to enjoy the lovely atmosphere and joined in the singing!

Afterwards refreshments were available in the Community Centre free of charge and were kindly provided by the Tesco store.

Father Christmas was on hand and was collecting for the Parish Council nominated charity Help for Heroes. The sum of

£226.17 was collected so thank you to those who donated.

Thanks to everyone involved in the organization of the event and watch this space for what will be organized this December!



Great Notley before your time

There's not much history in Great Notley, is there? What about the people who did the hard labour on the farmland where you now live?

Poorly paid men whose wages, after paying rent, went mostly on bread; bread which was eaten stale because it stayed with you longer. No vegans or vegetarians then because these people, who made up a huge proportion of the population, would have to eat anything they could come by. Their cottages were often poorly repaired, cold, damp and vermin infested where work clothes were still damp next day because the only protection available had been an old sack tied over their shoulders.

Women might make a few pence extra straw plaiting to make hats for the fashionable, their nimble fingered children would help. Older people could earn a pittance ston-picken (stone picking), back breaking work carried out with bare hands in freezing weather. The stones went for maintenance of the roads which were a quagmire in winter and dustbowls in summer. Little boys sent out to scare birds all day in remote fields, so lonely they would forgo the wooden clapper and shout instead - because you can't cry when you shout!

It helps me to ponder these things and sometimes I drive slowly and think of those who toiled thus before our time.

If local history interests you, why not join your local history society? Our venue is St Paul's Church, Hay Lane, Braintree and we meet on the fourth Monday of each month in the autumn, winter and spring at 7.45pm. Our next meeting is on Monday 28 February when the talk will be 'Getting an education in Essex 1700-1900 by Dr Jane Pearson, our fees are £12 per annum or £2.50 per talk for non-members.


2022 seems like it may be a better year than the last couple and we will all be able to get out and about with our cameras or phones and take pictures and look forward to our regular face to face club meetings.
