Summary and description of Assets

Seating



Green Seats in the following locations

- 4 around the green,
- one by the electricity substation by Penshurst place,
- four along the central path – behind Harnham Ave, behind Chestnut Ave, on approach to Queenborough Lane
- By the goalpost at Panners

Bins



The following litter bins are owned by the Parish Council

Next to youth shelter on green
Pathway 26 by cut through to Ennerdale Drive
Opposite the RAFT on other side of the road at the top of the continuation of Pathway 26
Pathway 32 by Penshurst Place
Near pond adjacent to 4 Bridge End Lane
Two in Panners Play area
Cut through at bottom of Ellen Way to Queenborough Lane
In Levens Way Play area
On footpath leading to underpass by Farriers Close
Adjacent to 22 Grantham Avenue by path leading behind Audley Close
On Derwent Way entrance to White Court Wood
In Community Centre Play area by basket swing
Pathway 32 by Harnham Drive
Pathway 32 by cut through to Ellen Way
At Panners by goalposts and rear entrance to Notley Green School
Next to Parish Noticeboard by Notley Green School
In the RAFT next to youth shelter

Dog Bins

The majority of dogs bins in the parish are the property of Braintree District Council however the following were purchased by the Parish Council in 2003

- Blickling Road by parish board
- Bridge End Lane on the path opposite the goalpost (now removed)
- By roundabout on Great Notley Ave by Stanstrete field

- Great Notley Ave by pathway to London Road near Mallard Close
- At Gilpin way entrance to White Court wood

In addition, in January 2015 the following dog bins were acquired by the Parish Council.

- On the path leading from Bridge End Lane by the goalpost at the junction with the path to the school
- By the community centre play area
- By Cuckoo Way at the junction with 'The Lemon'

Flag Poles

The Parish Council assumed the responsibility for the two flag poles next to the Hospital Memorial on 18th February 2013.

Maps boards and posts



Four boards were acquired and installed on 21/1/05 at Bridge End lane by the white gates, on approach to Great Notley Ave at entrance to village, on Queenborough Lane and at Tesco end of Cuckoo way. The maps were updated in February 2021. A new map board and posts was acquired in February 2021 and has been installed at the entrance to White Court.

Cycle Barriers

Two cycle barriers installed - One at cut through at Thorrington Close and the other at the top of Cuckoo Way by village gates

Bus Shelters



In July 2014 Essex County Council replaced two shelters with wooden shelters (as shown above) at no cost to the Parish Council and which are in the ownership of the Parish Council. The shelters are located by public house and by GP surgery on Notley Green.

Levens Way play area



Levens Way Play area contains the following -

Provided by Wicksteed prior to 2012 – climbing frame, turnstyle, multiplay, mushrooms, baby swings

Seesaw Springer and bike springer provided in November 2012 by Sutcliffe Play

Stepping pods, bridge and tunnel provided in November 2012 by Sutcliffe Play

Seating provided by Sutcliffe Play in November 2013

Junior Slide provided by Sutcliffe Play in November 2013

Junior Swings provided by Sutcliffe Play in November 2015

Roundabout provided in October 2017 by Wicksteed Play

Panners Play Area

Although owned and maintained by BDC records show a contribution of £12,000 made by the Parish council to the cost of this play area in 2006

Goal post at Panners

Supplied by BDC and renewed in 2022. BDC advise that they own the goalposts although it has been included in previous Parish Council asset schedules.

Recreational area for teenagers (RAFT)

Area upgraded in April 2021. A concrete skate facility was installed together with a youth shelter. Fresh fencing and goal ends and basket ball hoops were also installed.

Purchased 10/3/03 Base repaired and post re-stained in 2016.



Village Gates

A set of gates was installed at the entrance to the village at Bridge End Lane prior to 2012 and one entrance gates installed at the Tesco entrance to the garden village in September 2019.



Notice boards

Purchased 15th September 2011 and located at the community centre, by Notley green school, at entrance to White court and at Ellen Way. New board purchased in January 2017 and has been installed to replace the board by Notley Green school.
