

Braintree Community Diagnostic Centre takes shape

Work is well underway on the new Braintree Community Diagnostic Centre (CDC), with major construction milestones already achieved.

Located on the site of Braintree Community Hospital, the centre is set to open in early 2026. Once up and running, offering around 75,000 additional diagnostic appointments in its first year - helping to reduce waiting times and improve access to vital tests including CT and MRI scans, x-rays, ultrasounds, blood tests, and heart and lung checks.

Local representatives, including Sir James Cleverly, MP for Braintree and Shadow Secretary of State for Housing, Communities and Local Government, and senior council leaders, were given a first look at the progress during a site visit. Guests saw first-hand how the centre is taking shape and the impact it will have on healthcare in the region.

Julie Smith, Managing Director at Broomfield Hospital, said: "The Braintree Community Diagnostic Centre will be a huge boost for local healthcare. By offering faster access to vital tests and scans, we can speed up diagnosis, reduce anxiety for patients, and help clinicians make quicker decisions about treatment. This is a major investment in the health of our community, and it's exciting to see it starting to take shape."

Sir James Cleverly MP said: "I was proud to attend the groundbreaking of the new Community Diagnostic Centre earlier this year and it's great to see the work progressing well. The investment secured under the last Conservative government is being used well to benefit the local community. I can't wait to attend the opening ceremony."

Councillor Lynette Bowers-Flint, Cabinet Member for Housing, Health and Wellbeing at Braintree District Council, said: "It is encouraging to see real progress being made on the Braintree Diagnostic Centre. Once complete, this facility will offer residents guicker access to vital tests and scans, helping to ease pressure on hospitals and improve early diagnosis.



"The fact that it's on track to open in 2026 is a testament to the dedication of everyone involved."

Braintree CDC is one of four diagnostic centres being developed across mid and south Essex as part of a wider NHS programme. The Thurrock CDC is due to open this month, followed by Southend CDC later this year. The largest of the four, Pitsea CDC, is expected to open in winter 2026/27.

Andrew Finnegan, Senior Project Manager at McLaughlin & Harvey, said: "We're pleased to welcome back local stakeholders to show the construction progress that has been achieved to date on site. The project team knows the difference that the completed Centre will make to the community, and they are committed to delivering for them and the Trust."

Once complete, the Braintree CDC will be open seven days a week, offering a convenient "one-stop shop" for checks, tests, and scans all under one roof. It's a major step forward in making healthcare more accessible and efficient for local people.



The Coat of Hopes is a patchwork coat on an ongoing walking pilgrimage through the UK towards the end of the climate and ecological emergency.

In September 2025 the Coat of Hopes – an ever-evolving, community-created patchwork coat, on a pilgrimage through Britain towards the end of the climate and ecological emergency – completed this part of its journey on foot, of nearly 2000 miles so far, with a walk from Hastings to Newhaven. Newhaven was the place from where the then 'patchless' Coat set out in 2021 on its first continuous nineweek walk to Glasgow for the COP26 climate conference.

Since that very first day in 2021 the Coat of Hopes has continued to walk throughout the land, collecting people's hopes for the places they live in the face of climate and ecological breakdown. The organisers are committed to continuing the Coat's journey, until the climate and ecological situation is no longer an emergency. There is no end in sight.

Barbara Keal from Lewes, instigating artist of the Coat said: "When faced with the enormity of climate and ecological breakdown, I see our

> > The energy to change our way of living must come from love and a willinaness to act on behalf of others. Walking with the Coat of Hopes is a practice which develops these attributes,

which is liveable.



even as we invite strangers throughout the land to put on this Coat of Hopes and 'wear the promise that we all belong together'. Every walking day we lean into an unknown future and find fellow humans who are willing to help us on this

impossible journey of witness."

The Coat of Hopes is now in the fourth year of this pilgrimage-without-end and bears well over 700 patches. Everyone is invited to make a patch and, wherever the Coat goes, it carries an invitation to all who are willing, to wear it, hear its song, and stand for a moment in consciousness of our interconnectedness with each other and all life and what that might ask of us in the way we live our lives. Thousands of people have participated in this way.

This is not a funded project, but a free movement of people for hope in our shared future, it can happen only through the goodwill of people who choose to walk, sew, sing with, feed or shelter strangers. All are welcome to join this work in any of those ways and all these things will be needed when the Coat continues its pilgrimage in 2026, heading for Land's End.

New officers ready to keep neighbourhoods safe

Protecting and serving Essex

That's the message from our Chief Constable to the 69 new officers who took their oaths in September ready to start keeping your neighbourhood safe.

Chief Constable Ben-Julian Harrington was joined by Mrs Jennifer Tolhurst the Lord Lieutenant of Essex, Mrs Julie Fosh, the High Sherrif and the Police, Fire, and Crime Commissioner Roger Hirst, as well as the friends and loved ones of the officers on their way to join Neighbourhood Policing Teams and Commands across the county.

In his speech to the new recruits the Chief outlined the cornerstone of policing: "Fairness, integrity, diligence and impartiality." He also said the work of every officer will be, rightly, the subject to scrutiny.

On the very same day, officers from the Braintree district attended two separate vehicle fires. They shared the news with residents alongside a safety warning:

"On Friday (5th Sept), officers attended two separate vehicle fires on the A120, just a few hours apart and only yards from each other. Thankfully, no one was injured in either incident, and both were dealt with swiftly.

"We were deeply moved to receive this message from a grateful parent: 'On Friday you

attended a car fire on the A120, this was my son who was extremely shaken up and was grateful for the support and help you gave him.

'As his Dad, I just wanted to say a big thank you. Car fires have a bad habit of escalating very quickly and he tells me you got to him very quickly.

'This type of work goes unseen by the general public... Fortunately, you were very close, things could have been a lot worse.'

"Thank you for your kind words – they mean a lot to our team."

Braintree Area Foodbank makes urgent call for support this harvest

Braintree Area Foodbank is calling on the community to support people facing hardship in their local community as need remains persistently high.

The Foodbank, with centres in Braintree. Witham, Halstead and Sible Hedingham, is urging people in the Braintree District to support their community this Harvest time, after the charity's end of year stats report revealed that in the past 5 years, there's been a 100% increase in the number of emergency food parcels needed by people in Braintree, with nearly 12,000 emergency food parcels being distributed in 2024/25 alone.

Sarah Dynan, Community Outreach Officer at Braintree Area Foodbank, says: "Any support from local people – whether it's volunteering, donating food or money, or simply raising awareness – can make a huge difference for those who rely on the Foodbank."

She continues: "This Harvest season, we're reaching out to our community to help us ease the burden of isolation faced by those experiencing hardship. No one should feel alone in their struggle."

"For many of the individuals we support, coming to the foodbank may be one of the few social interactions they have all week. We've come to realise that we're not just offering food - we're offering a warm welcome and a sense of connection. With the community's help this Harvest, we can continue tackling hunger and the desperate circumstances some people face."

Braintree Area Foodbank also offers a team of speakers available to share more about their work. They provide tailored resources for schools – from nursery through to secondary - as well as materials adapted to suit different groups or faiths.

Over the last year, Foodbanks in the Trussell community have experienced record levels of need as more people struggle to afford the essentials and it is likely that this situation will only worsen this winter - so this Harvest



is a particularly important time for local communities to support the foodbank.

Locals are urged to help in many ways, includina:

- Donating non-perishable goods, such as canned goods, pasta, rice, and hygiene products.
- Financial contributions, which allow the charity to purchase essential items and maintain its operations efficiently.

Emma Revie, chief executive at Trussell says: "We know that many people turn to Foodbanks as a last resort and feel embarrassed that they need to ask for help but Foodbanks across the country are there to offer a warm welcome, provide essential items and help people access services that can lift them out of poverty.

"By coming together and supporting Braintree Area Foodbank this Harvest and through to winter you are not just offering a meal you are extending a hand of friendship, combating isolation, and helping to provide an environment where everyone is valued."



THE CASTLE, GREAT LEIGHS

It's reported that over 100 people have attempted to spend the night there and experience poltergeist activity - furniture moving on its own, guests' belongings thrown around - as well as disembodied screams keeping them up at night.

WORKING OVERTIME AT COLCHESTER POLICE STATION

One resident shared a story from their father, who put no stock in the ghost stories until he experienced something unexplainable.

"Having sorted out the paperwork in his office, he made his way down to custody via the stairs. Just as he took his first step down, all the lights went off. The temperature, he says, literally plummeted. In the very poor light, he saw what he can only describe as a hooded figure which appeared to be floating near to the bottom of the stairs. My Dad being my Dad just said aloud, 'Stop messing me around and put the bloody lights on!' At which point the figure faded and the lights indeed blinked on."

Over £2,500 raised for charities in Public Sector Challenge



On Friday 5th September, twelve employees from Braintree District Council took part in the Public Sector Challenge, raising £2,573 for Cancer Research UK and the British Heart Foundation. The challenge itself was a demanding hike through the Peak District, with participants tackling either an 8 mile, 18.5 mile route or a more gruelling 26 mile trek, climbing to an ascent of around 5,400 feet. The team at Braintree joined 800 participants from other public sector organisations and businesses, collectively raising nearly £100,000 - bringing the total raised since 2023 to £331,000. The fundraising efforts locally included a raffle, cake sale, silent auction and individual contributions. Are you getting enough Vitamin D?

To keep bones and muscles healthy, everyone should consider taking a daily vitamin

D supplement in autumn and winter, when we cannot make enough vitamin D from sunlight. And some people should take them all year round, including children up to the age of 4 and people who are at risk of not getting enough vitamin D. Just 10 micrograms a day is all you need – it's the same for kids and grown-ups. In these gloomier months, useful sources include: oily fish – such as salmon, sardines, trout, herring or mackerel; red meat; egg yolks; fortified foods – such as some fat spreads and breakfast cereals: liver (avoid liver if vou're pregnant). In the UK, cows' milk is generally not a good source of vitamin D because it is not fortified, as it is in some other countries. LGR Update from BDC

Braintree District Council's Leader has confirmed the council's preferred option for the future of local government in Greater Essex as the 3 unitary council proposal. This follows a constructive debate held at the council's Full Council meeting on Monday 15th September, where councillors shared views on all four proposals developed for Greater Essex - an option for a three unitary model, one for a five unitary model and two proposals for models of four unitary councils. There was a clear preference (65%) from councillors who indicated they favoured the three unitary authority model, a proposal led by Essex County Council, which would group Braintree with Colchester, Tendring and Uttlesford, alongside Essex. Councillors shared views on the proposal, including it would help make services more financially secure, create more opportunities for growth, bring together areas that naturally fit, and build on the strong relationships the council already has with neighbouring councils. Monitors can be borrowed for up to two weeks. No booking is required, monitors are available on a first-come, first-served basis.



Hearty Harvest Recipes

Make the most of autumn flavours with plentiful plates.

The shelves at your local farm shops are always stocked with the best seasonal produce. Harvest is a bountiful time with both summer and autumn crops making way for some delicious dishes. Here are some easy recipes to level up your mid-week dinner or stun guests at a Sunday roast.

ROASTED BEETROOT AND APPLE SALAD

For the days where there's a chill in the air when you wake up, but you're sweating through your jumper by noon.



Ingredients (serves four):

- 500g fresh beetroot, peeled and chopped into wedges
- · 2 eating apples, cored and sliced
- 2 tbsp olive oil
- 100g soft goat's cheese
- 50g walnuts, roughly chopped
- 75g watercress or mixed leaves
- 1 tbsp balsamic vinegar
- Sea salt and black pepper

Instructions:

- 1. Preheat the oven to 200°C (fan 180°C) / Gas mark 6.
- Toss the beetroot with 1 tbsp olive oil, salt, and pepper. Roast in a tray for 30-35 minutes, or until tender.
- 3. In the last 10 minutes of roasting, add the apple slices to the tray to soften slightly.
- 4. Toast the walnuts in a dry frying pan for 2-3 minutes, stirring frequently until golden.
- 5. In a large bowl, mix the watercress with the roasted beetroot and apple. Drizzle over remaining olive oil and balsamic vinegar.

 Crumble the goat's cheese and sprinkle over the walnuts. Serve warm or at room temperature.

PLUM AND BLACKBERRY CRUMBLE

Is there any greater comfort than a sweet, warm crumble?



Ingredients (serves six):

For the fruit filling

- 400g ripe British plums, halved and stoned
- 200g fresh blackberries
- 75g golden caster sugar
- 1 tsp ground cinnamon
- Juice of ½ a lemon

For the crumble topping

- 150g plain flour
- 100g unsalted butter, chilled and cubed
- 75g demerara sugar
- 30g rolled oats
- · Pinch of salt

Instructions:

- 1. Preheat the oven to 190°C (fan 170°C) / Gasmark 5.
- In a large bowl, toss plums and blackberries with sugar, cinnamon, and lemon juice. Transfer to a baking dish.
- In a bowl, use your fingers to rub the butter into the flour until it resembles breadcrumbs. Stir in demerara sugar, oats, and a pinch of salt.
- 4. Scatter the crumble mixture over the fruit and bake for 30-35 minutes until golden and bubbling.
- 5. Serve warm with custard, cream, or ice cream.

New 3G football pitch opened at **Lift New Rickstones in Witham**

A brand-new artificial grass pitch (AGP) to boost grassroots sport in Witham has opened at Lift New Rickstones.

This is a brilliant example of how investment from new developments is directly benefiting both new and existing residents, giving everyone greater access to the sport facilities they've told us they want. We are committed to utilising the planning process to bring in as much Section 106 funding as possible, so they can be reinvested in projects like this to benefit our communities."

Lift New Rickstones interim principal Simon Cox, said: "The new 3G pitch is a fantastic addition to our school and wider community.

"It provides our students and community members with a high-quality space to learn, train and compete. This project began many years ago, and I'd like to recognise the late Simon Gibbs, our former principal, whose vision and dedication played such a key role in making it a reality and our lettings manager, Ben Moore, who has been integral to the whole project. The opening of the new pitch reflects our commitment to giving every young person in Witham the very best opportunities to thrive in a safe environment."

Nick Emery, Head of Development and Investment at Essex County FA, said: "Grassroots football plays a vital role in strengthening local communities, and developments like this expand access to playing opportunities, helping more people to enjoy the many benefits of the game. We were delighted to work closely with Braintree District Council to deliver this 3G AGP as part of a wider portfolio of projects across the district. It will make a significant difference to the thriving grassroots football community of Witham, and the surrounding areas."

Robert Sullivan, Chief Executive of the Football Foundation, said: "The Football Foundation is working closely with our partners – the Premier League, The FA and Government – to transform the quality of grassroots facilities in England by delivering projects like this across the country. 
